- Virtual Computer Lab



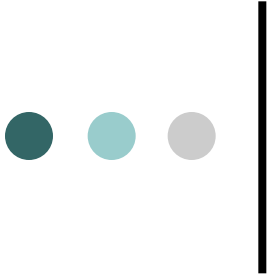
# Reasons For Choosing A Synchronous Delivery Method

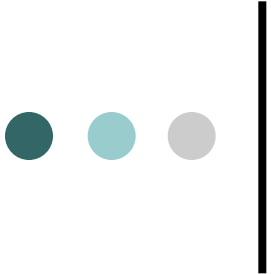
# Considerations When Using Synchronous Tools

- Technical Requirements
- Technical Support
- Preparing Students ahead of Time
- Different Time Zones
- Recording Options
- Attendance Requirements
- Backup Plans
- Content

# Preparing for Synchronous Sessions

- Use a Script
  - Create a script with as much detail as possible, including answers to common questions, etc.
- Practice
  - Make time to practice using the technology and becoming familiar with it.
  - Offer a practice session for students that is not graded and provides them the opportunity to test equipment and become familiar with environment.
  - Provide Netiquette Standards to students prior to the session.



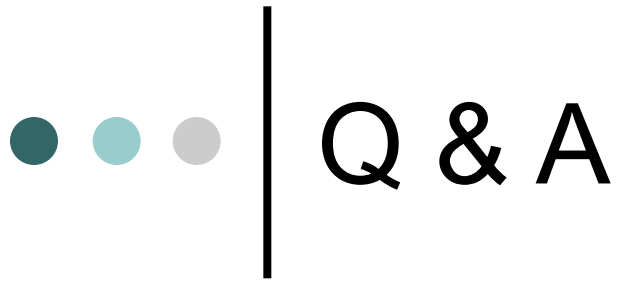
# Delivering Synchronous Sessions

- Arrange for a practice environment
- Arrive early to setup
- Provide plenty of activities that allow participants to talk, vote, use the whiteboard, etc.
- When possible, have another person as the producer – one who will help with technical problems, upload slides, etc.
